	Love and were valuable tools that slaves used to cope with the condition of their lives, but those tools could also be used against them by slave-owners who wished to use fear & anguish to control their slaves.
	By the 1770s, many began to free their slaves, having concluded that slavery was inconsistent with their Christian values.
	When the Constitution was written, it was decided that slaves would not count as full human beings when counting the population of a state. Slaves, it was decided, would count asfifths of a person.
